



Your pet rabbit has had a general anaesthetic and may still be feeling a little subdued.

1. Keep him/her quiet for the first night and bring indoors to a cool room or garage if the weather is cold. Avoid too warm temperatures, e.g. a centrally heated home, as rabbits are very susceptible to heat stress.
2. Check any stitches 2 to 3 times daily to make sure none have been removed. Any redness, oozing or bleeding should be reported to us straight away.
3. Bedding should be changed daily for the first week post operatively. Avoid dusty bedding such as sawdust.
4. Feed normal rabbit food, hay and water. Ensure your pet is eating and drinking by the following morning. If not, please contact us immediately.
5. In cases of surgery around the mouth or dental work, soft food or shredded food is best. Offer banana, grated carrot or a vegetable baby food, weaning back on to hay and other food over the following 2 to 3 days.
6. If your pet has not made a full recovery within 36 hours of the anaesthetic please let us know.
7. Your pet needs a check-up in 2 days.
